

A close relative of the Mourning Cloak, Milbert's Tortoiseshell prefers the cool temperatures of northern latitudes (it is absent from Alaska, however); it may also be found further south in alpine meadows. Its dark coloration is typical of butterflies of cooler climates, dark tones absorbing heat from the sun more readily than lighter tones. The dark areas of its two-toned wings thus help to regulate the Milbert's Tortoiseshell's body temperature.
