

Wednesday, July 15th - Coping with Covid - Morning

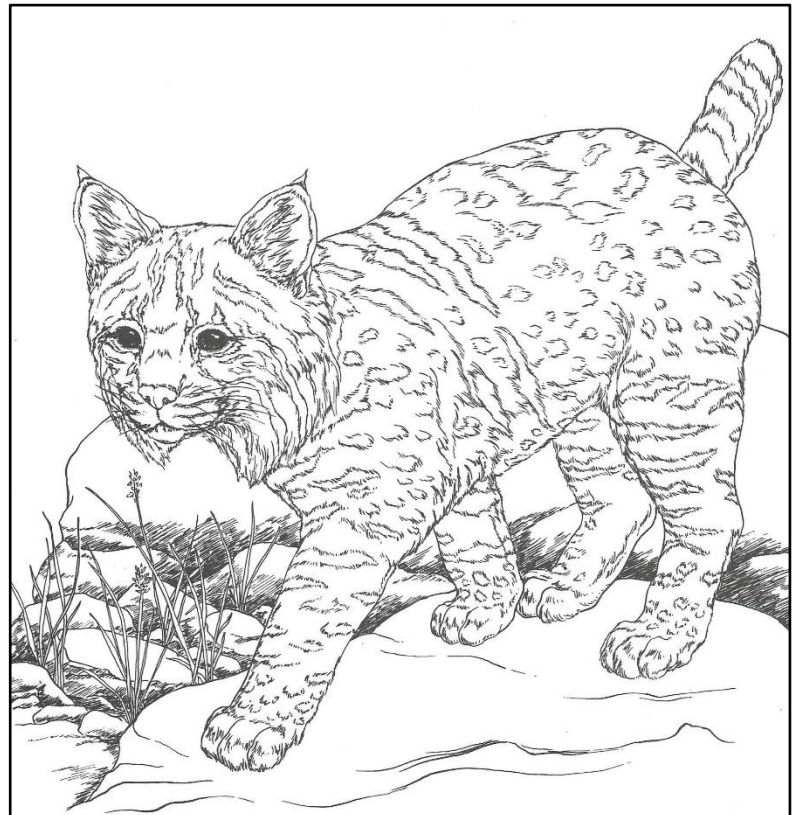
